FROM THE PILLAR OF BEAUTY

Happy New Year Brethren. As we close the past year, and open a new, we take pause to reflect upon the significance of the events from the preceding year. It causes oneself to wonder at the passing of time, and the cyclical nature of our lives. During the ascending phases of our lives, priorities and preoccupations dissolve and emerge anew. As we move forward, the measure of our lives is to be set by our own selves; it is the content of the actions we choose to undertake. Look back, take measure and strike out again.

Here I share with you some of the articles which I have collected in the preceding year during lodge; and now carry forward into the New Year.

From the educational sessions of Bro. Devon Briese on meditation the Importance of allotting to oneself time of reflective connection to the universe that exists just outside of our conscious existence.

During the visit and lecture of Wor. Timothy Hogan on Alchemy and Cabbala, I learned of certain geometric patterns inscribed in the Cathedrals of Europe. This inspired me to search out and study the scarcely publicized science of Cymatics. It is demonstrated by the formation of distinct geometric patterns, caused by vibrational excitation of granular particles, on flat metallic membranes. With waterborne molecular structure they are living stones that illuminate pale green throughout when exposed to ultraviolet light. Formed drop by drop, hidden from the world above, in complete darkness.

And so we go my brothers, brick by brick, stone by stone. Look up ahead; it is the measure of our lives.
