

FROM A ROUGH TO A SMOOTH ASHLAR: PREPARING YOURSELF

Tools of The Entered Apprentice are The Twenty-Four Inch Gauge, The Common Gavel and The Chisel. The Entered Apprentice is given of preparation; tools responsibly as a Mason, since he really doesn't know the design or plan, is just to learn to use his tools. The Apprentice, with practice, will take a stone from the quarry and use the tools given him to cut his stone (his inner self) into the basic shape of the Rough Ashlar. The Apprentice uses the Twentyfour Inch Gauge as a reminder not only that he is mortal, but also that he should not waste any of his precious time here on earth. The Common Gavel represents the Masons conscience. His inner voice, that if he lets it guide his actions to

do what's right, he will become a better man. With the Gavel he removes larger flaws in his character. The Chisel is the final tool of the Apprentice and the tool that should never leave his hand. It points to the advantage of education and discipline. It draws the Apprentice's attention to his daily advancement in Masonic knowledge and readies him for the Second Degree.

The tools of the Fellowcraft are tools of proof and have slightly deeper symbolism and are arranged to indicate a different order of achievement. The symbolic meaning of The Square is simply, treat everyone as you would want to be treated. That's

really what acting on the square is. The Level delves deeper into the idea that all Masons are equal no matter their station in life or place in the Lodge. It's deeper meaning tends to be missed by many especially in these days of unlimited distraction. That being, as Masons we should work to the Full Length of our Cable Tow with respect to our Lodge and Brothers. The Plum is the emblem of integrity. It teaches Masons that a man of integrity does not envy the wealth, power, or intelligence and good fortune of another. Rather he promotes the advancement of others, and holds the scales of justice with equal poise. The lessons found in the ritual of the Fellowcraft degree can be found in the framing documents of the United States of America.

The tools of The Master Mason are those of planning, design and layout. The first of his tools is the Skirret. You may know it as a chalk line or real of string. Master Mason's are taught to use this tool to mark out a straight and narrow path of conduct. The Pencil is a tool of teaching, reminding the Master to share the light he's obtained with his brothers. The Compass reminds the Master Mason that while circumscribes his place in the world, all of his actions effects both positive negatively. We as Masons should always consider the Compass's path and make our chooses for the betterment of all, rather then ourselves. The final tool found in the Master's hand is The Trowel. With The Trowel the Master of the craft spreads the Cement of brotherly love and affection which unites us into one sacred society. On a larger scale these tools are used together to teach the most important lesson of all, that of always working towards being respectful of others. While walking upon the line of our lives, we leave makes in the book of life, both good and bad. These marks not only effect our lives but also the lives of those we come into contact with. Hopefully at the end of our time here, we will have spread more joy then misery.
