

In January Odes Aldo Martini, PM was called from labor just a few days shy of his 92nd birthday. Bro. Martini's contributions to SW Hackett Lodge were many, and he lived a storied life. His funeral service was held in Rancho Penesquitos and was well attended by family friends and brothers and ladies from our lodge. His son Lance delivered a moving eulogy that sketched Odes' many talents and life experiences. Bro. Martini said that as a child he listened to his fathers many stories and thought they were fairy tales, but that as he grew older and heard the same stories from the people who were in them, he realized they were fact and not fiction. Diving with Jacques Cousteau, flying under bridges, hunting with the Shah of Iran and other recollections of Odes most of us were lucky enough to hear once or twice were retold. Lance also recalled watching the movie The Godfather with his father and said Odes were name the real life characters he grew up with on the streets of New York, and how they died. By trade Odes was a metalworker and gunsmith of great renown. Ultimately this led to ballistics work and expert witness work in solving criminal cases in San Diego.

In case you are not aware of it already, the rods in our lodge were crafted by Odes in his workshop, and he donated a block of wood from the oldest commissioned battleship in the United States, the Constitution, which hangs on the wall of the lodge office. This is only an initial report for the purpose of updating you as to our progress and must still be agreed upon by both Lodge's consolidation committees. After the committees joint agreement upon said terms a written Resolution must be presented to each Lodge at their Stated Meeting. A majority vote, approving the resolution, at the Stated Meeting will cause written consent forms to be transmitted to each of the Lodge's respective Brother's for their signatures approving or refusing to approve the Resolution. Following the third Stated Meeting after approving the Resolution, the Master of each Lodge must certify the signatures its member's consents. A seventy-five percent (75%) vote for approval for consolidation is required from each Lodge. See CMC Chapter 13,

Section 813.010.

SAVE SWH LODGE CMTE REPORT TO THE MEMBERS

Brethren:

The first time our committed met was to identify our problems and come up with solutions to fix them. We came together again with the idea of firming up our plan to get our Lodge back on track.

We were all in agreement that we need to attract like minded men, while not losing what makes Hackett Special. We need to start with our current brothers to either get them raised or get them back into lodge. We feel that by activating the Grand Lodge's Candidate Mentoring Program we can accomplish both of these goals. By combining our missing brothers with our EA's & FC's we can get both sets of brothers working together and participating in their lodge.

Our next mission is membership acquisition. The goal is to get our Lodge name out to the public. And these are the ideas we would like to move forward with: Advertising in local newspapers, Our Lodge facebook Participating in local Parades, Participating in Street Fairs, Masonic Info Nights, Masonic speakers by offering to speak for public functions, Going to

various restaurants before Stated meetings, in Tuxedos, people will ask about us, this creates a buzz and I have personal experience in seeing results from this interaction.

With respect to our Finances, it is important to note that, things are not as bleak as they seem. Remember we Masons are taught, in the 2nd degree, that everything runs in cycles.

We first looked into our expenses and noticed that we might be able to save some money, in even small amounts it adds up. Some of the things we have considered and are working on are:

Looking into an alternative Lodge rental. If this were to occur, we may save as much as two to three hundred dollars a month which would be significant.

Changing stated meeting dinners to either a restaurants or bringing in dinners.

We are considering emailing the Trestle board how much we money we will save depends on how many participate.

What we really must do is increase our income. To that end, we have 28 EA & FC

Brothers that we must help get to Master Mason. We are already making strides in increasing our membership, as evidenced by the following fact: Although by no means a "stellar" year, according to the Grand Lodge roster, in 2010, we saw our largest increase in membership since at least 1941, with 9 initiations, advances or affiliations, and we are already on track to beat that number by far, beginning with a possible six new initiations and one affiliation that could take place within the first quarter of this year.

Financially, in 2008, we lost a good deal of money in our investment portfolio; several brothers, have reported that they have gained back, in just the last year, anywhere from 7 to 25 percent of what they had personally lost in their portfolios. While others are gaining back their losses, we continue to lose, or at best are making less than 1% this is just not acceptable. And, this is happening while the stock market has recovered over 36 percent

since the low in March of 2009.

We believe that SW Hackett Lodge is still very viable and stronger that it may appear in some cases. With this belief and with energy from our members to accomplish some of the above work, we know that Hackett can thrive well into the future.
