The expenses in question have to do with the Secretary and Wardens Retreats and Grand Lodge Communication. The confusion has to do with what percentage the Lodge should pay for the officers to attend these Communications.

Over the years the costs for these communications have increased but the amount paid by the Lodge has stayed the same or in the case of last year went down. As a result of the financial gap, I opted not to attend the last couple of years sessions to give the other officers my money so they would not be out of pocket. It is my opinion, that since these communications are of a benefit to the Lodge only and really don't benefit the brothers who attend personally, that these sessions should be paid for by the Lodge and not the brother himself.

Therefore my budget reflected the actual costs, rounded up, required to attend, rather than arbitrary dollar amounts reflecting either, what the Lodge paid in the past or an amount pulled from thin air. The questions for consideration will be: what percentage the Lodge should pay, if the Lodge should pay for the wives to attend, how do we pay for the amount agreed upon, i.e. pull from investments, increased dues, or some other plan TBD.

These are the expenses that will apply this year:

Secretaries & Treasurer Retreat Costs per attendee early registered price \$225, room \$224 plus taxes, about \$40, self parking \$10, spouse lunch \$42, spouse dinner \$78, breakfasts are not included, if they eat at the hotel add another \$80 for the Brother and another \$80 for their spouse, they can go out for Breakfasts for about \$50 for both, gas about \$50. Bringing the Total to about \$830 on the high side and \$720 if they go out for breakfast.

Master & Wardens Retreat Costs per attendee - early registered price \$285, room \$222 plus taxes, about \$40, self parking \$TBD, spouse early registered price \$285, breakfasts are not included, if they eat at the

hotel add another \$80 for the Brother and another \$80 for their spouse, they can go out for Breakfasts for about \$50 for both, gas about \$50. Bringing the Total to about \$1,042 on the high side and \$932 if they go out for breakfast.

Grand Lodge Communication Costs per attendee - GL has not yet posted the room costs but they will be bewteen \$700 to \$900 plus taxes, about \$80, self parking about \$120, they might be able to park at GL for free, but without "in and out" prevlegies, requiring cabs or public transporation costs, travel will run about \$250 each to fly so \$500 per couple or about \$250 for gas. As they are not locked into a hotel, they are usually on their own for meals. Meals in SF run roughly breakfasts 12-25 per, lunches 15-30 per and dinners 25 plus per. Obviouly these cost will only be going up every year.

I look forward to hearing all opinions on this matter as well as coming up with a plan to help with our future budgets.

Remember my Brothers Tuesday night is Lodge night see you there.

February 14th and was known as the Feast of Lupercalia.
