Yet here I am talking to them, shaking their hands, and instead of joining them in their illness, my brain says I don't get sick and therefor I don't. It's amazing just how simple it really is the mind, YOUR mind, can do anything if you believe it can. But you have to truly believe it is so.

equilibrium between interdependent elements, especially as maintained by physiological processes. How this works is that your brain likes what it knows even if what it knows is bad for you. Quitting smoking is the perfect example of the brain's want for homeostasis, working against its own interest. The brain convinces itself that quitting smoking is too hard, and the struggle begins.

Over the years I've mentioned a high school girlfriend's mother, "M" who studied with Brother Manly P. Hall. Among the many incredible things I watched her do was faith healing. On many occasions I would watch and or join in with the laying on of hands or other modalities depending on the belief system of the person. It was an interesting education. People would hear about her and come to her home for help. She wouldn't just ask about their ailment but would talk to them about their beliefs to get a better understanding of how to get past their brains need for homeostasis.

The most important point is the fact that not only does a person have to believe in the ability of the brain and healer to cure, but that they must know that they are worthy of the cure. I saw a strong Christian woman suffering from cancer but her healing was delayed since she said that she didn't feel worthy of Jesus' help. The negativity of homeostasis was helping to keep her ill. She had done some things in her youth that made her feel shame and unworthy. "M" changed the modality to break the negativity and get past her brain's need for homeostasis. The lady eventually passed away but years later than her doctors gave her.

I've also mentioned a Brother "F.J." who was a faith healer himself. He'd been a healer for many years and was well skilled in the brains abilities. When he was 79 he came down with lymph cancer and was given only 6 months. That brother passed away peacefully at home, he was 89. 
### THE PAST MASTER'S SYMBOL



FROM THE SOUTH

#### Brethren:

I would like to follow-up lasts months article on Solstices, and take perspectives differing from our observation of the position of the Sun with respect to the Earths Horizons. First, from much farther away:



As the Sun travels about the center of the Galaxy, the Earth travels in a corkscrew type spiral along the path of the Sun, and likewise the Moon traverses a smaller spiral along the path of the Earth. Similarly, all of the other Planets and Moons dance together along this Helical Precession.

From a much closer perspective, to measure and perceive these things with our senses and intellect, we utilize the Five Postulates of 3<sup>rd</sup> Century BC Greek Mathematician, Euclid of Alexandria (the Father of Geometry).

- 1. A straight line segment can be drawn joining any two points.
- 2. Any straight line segment can be extended indefinitely in a straight line.
- 3. Given any straight line segment, a circle can be drawn having the segment as radius and one endpoint as center.
- 4. All Right Angles are equal to one another.
- 5. Given a line and a point, not on that line, there is one line that passes through that point and is parallel to the given line.

These Five Postulates hold for our local perspective, which is called Euclidian Geometry, but from our perspective of a Larger Universe, where Gravity bends Light and Space itself is curved. Straight lines can be curved, and curved lines can be straight. It is all relative to our perspective.

I can take comfort in understanding what I can see with my own Eyes. Jupiter, Mars and Saturn are the morning Planets because we are catching up to them, and Venus is the evening Planet because it has already passed us, and gone around the Sun.

The Past Master's Symbol is an often seen but not so frequently explained Masonic Symbol. It commonly consists of The Compass, Sun, and Quadrant (or Protractor), and in most jurisdictions a Square.

The Compass has a familiar interpretations for it is by the Compass that a Mason is reminded to keep his actions within due bounds. The Square also has a familiar meaning, for in Acting on the Square a Mason conducts himself honestly, with morality and virtue. The Square is the Master's jewel (a reminder of how he should govern), and is a part of the Past Master's Symbol as a reminder of the office he held.

The Quadrant is the arc that the compass rests upon, either below or in place of the square on the familiar symbol of the fraternity. The Quadrant shows what angle the Compass is opened at. Symbolically, as every Mason is supposed to use the Compass to keep his actions within due bounds. It is The Quadrant that measures those due bounds, and it is the responsibility of the Master of the Lodge to ensure that Masons under his jurisdiction are making proper use of their own Compass. The Quadrant also shows the Compass to be opened to 60 degrees, the angle of an equilateral triangle, which is a symbol of balance.

The Compass paired with the Quadrant could also be seen as a Sextant a navigation tool used to measure position. The Sextant symbolizes that not only did the Past Master have to navigate the course of his Lodge in the past, but also that he is qualified to do so, should his successors require his advice or assistance.

The Sun represents Light and the Master of a Lodge is supposed to be a source of Masonic Light. It also signifies that the Past Master has observed the sun at meridian height (the South), setting (the West), and rising (the East).

In the some jurisdictions around the world, The 47th Problem of Euclid Suspended by a Square is used as The Past Master's Symbol. The 47th Problem of Euclid (also known as the Pythagorean Theorem) is used to prove a square a vital skill to ancient builders. Suspended by the Square, the symbol represents the knowledge and wisdom that a Past Master has gained from his service to his Lodge and Masonry in general.
