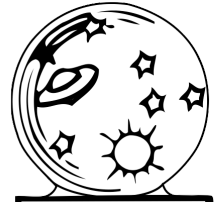
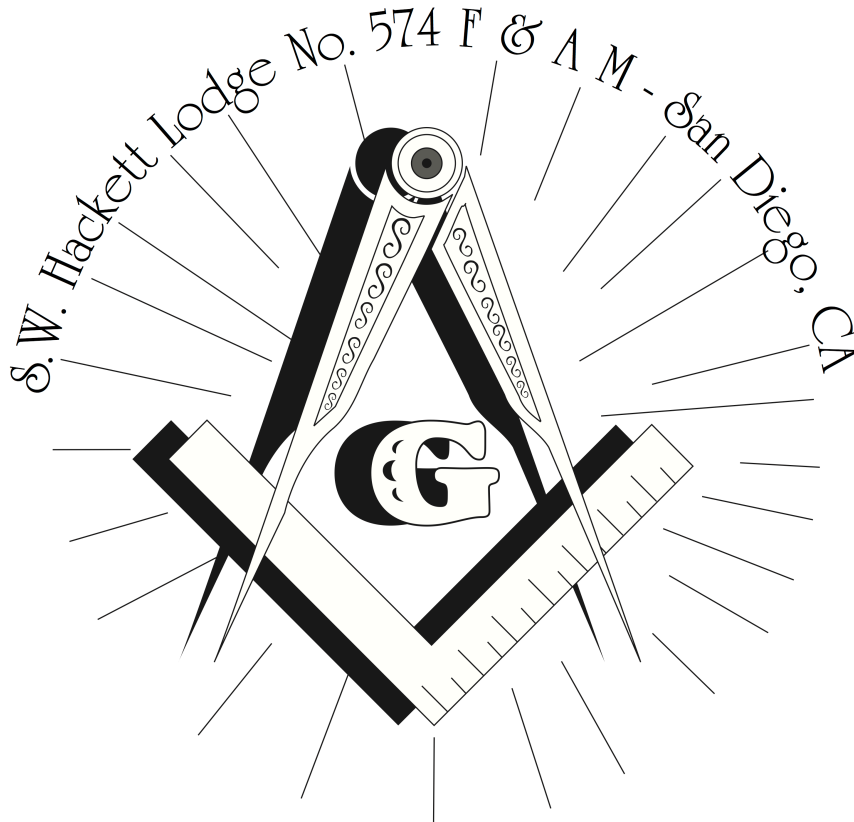

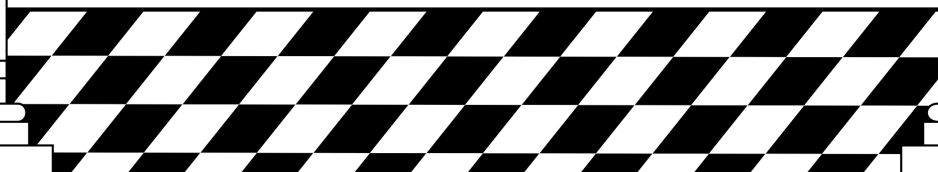

Brethren and Ladies,

On Saturday, December 22, many of the Brethren, Ladies and some of the member's children from S.W. Hackett Lodge met to organize and deliver food, bags full of presents, and \$50.00 cash to six needy families in our community.

This is a multi-stage project that we've done every year for 20 years now!

First, the secretary and staff at the site we partner with, Sequoia Elementary School in Clairemont, identify six families that are having a challenging time. The site staff and our

Partnership in Education Liaison work together to ensure that we have the necessary information to fulfill the needs of the various families.

Next, usually at the October or November Stated Meeting, the Lodge Brethren and Ladies volunteer to buy either some of the necessary food items (for example three turkeys, or three gallons of milk, or six boxes of stuffing) or gifts for the children. The volunteers who purchase gifts receive a list of the children in the family, their names, genders, and interests (for example "Son, Pat, 7 years old: likes anything to do with baseball and Hot Wheels"). The volunteer then purchases, wraps and addresses the presents for the individual children in the family.

Some members buy things but can't actually participate on the day of delivery so they make arrangements to get the things to another Brother who can. Many Brothers who don't want to shop or

who don't get a chance to volunteer simply contribute cash to the Partnership in Education account to cover the cash donation and other programs. However the members choose to participate, on the day of delivery everything comes together and three teams are sent out in different directions to make two deliveries each.

Take a moment to imagine any scenario you'd like, perhaps a grandmother raising her three grandchildren on a fixed income. There are a number of stressors in your life and the holidays are fast approaching – what kind of choices are you going to make? There will need to be sacrifices. Then you are informed that your family has been selected to receive individually wrapped presents for all the kids in the house based on their interests, food for the whole family to have a wonderful dinner (and plenty of leftovers, too) as well as an extra \$50
