MASONIC ETIQUETTE AND CONDUCT

The Charge of the Third Degree places much emphasis on the conduct of a Master Mason. It seems to assume that the newly made Master Mason is fully aware of the pitfalls into which he may stumble, for, it says that he is authorized to correct the irregularities of his less than informed brethren. Much, however, remains to be gained by the new Master Mason in knowledge and appreciation of the practical aspects of our conduct, both in the lodge and afield, among strange or mixed company.

It might be well to remark here that one of the charges to which the Master himself must assent before his installation enjoins him to be cautious in carriage and behavior, courteous to his brethren and faithful to his lodge. This, then, is equally expected of each member – that the spirit of brotherly love and affection, by which we are bound together, will be exemplified in our conduct at all times. The Master alone has been clothed with the responsibility of his office. It is, therefore, not only a matter of courtesy to obey his gavel, it is a serious Masonic offense to ignore or disobey it.

In our ancient charges, approved in 1722, appears the following:

"You are not to hold private committees of separate conversations, without leave from the Master, to talk of anything impertinent or unseemly, nor interrupt the Master or Wardens or any brother speaking to the Master; nor behave yourself ludicrously or jestingly while this lodge is engaged in what is serious or solemn."

Common courtesy and good taste alike forbid joking or horseplay during the ceremonies. The great lessons of Masonry which are taught by our ritual should never be demeaned by levity or pranks; neither the anteroom nor the lodge room is a proper location for the telling of off-color stories or practical jokes.

The ancient charges say that "you are to salute one another in a courteous manner, calling each Brother; you shall call all Masons your fellows, or your brethren, and no other names."

Just as it is common courtesy to be accurate in speaking a brothers name, so it is proper Masonic etiquette to address both officers, members, and visitors by their correct Masonic titles and addresses.

FROM THE PILLAR OF BEAUTY

Brethren and ladies:

What are the lesser lights?

At the opening and closing of every lodge, the three great lights of Masonry – which we are taught as Masons are the Holy Bible, Square and Compass - are brought to view by aid of the three lesser lights, representing the Sun, Moon and Master of the Lodge. But have you ever wondered how this all came about? Why do the lesser lights represent the Sun, Moon and Master of the Lodge? After careful research, I came upon an article which really shed some light on the questions I had about the lesser lights and their purpose.

Altar such as to form a triangle. But why do they form a triangle? In some jurisdictions they are closely about the Altar, in others, one is placed at each of the stations of the three principal officers – or pillars – of the lodge; The Worshipful Master, Senior Warden and Junior Warden. But why three lights? Why not four or five? As we are taught in freemasonry the number three plays a significant role throughout our Ancient Craft – the three degrees of Masonry, three steps, three ancient Grand Masters (King Solomon, Hiram of Tyre and Hiram Abif) and so on.

Surprisingly enough the number three is the first of the great Sacred Numbers of the Ancient Mysteries and is the numerical symbol of God. While many religions of many ages and its peoples have conceived of Divinity as a Trinity, the figure three as a symbol of God is far older than any Trinitarian Doctrine. It comes from the triangle, which is the first possible figure made up of straight lines which are without either beginning or ending. One line or two lines have ends. They start and finish. The triangle, like the square or the five or more sided figures, has no loose ends. And the triangle is the first of these which can be made; as God was always considered as first; and also as without either beginning or ending, the triangle itself became a symbol of Deity.

So no matter how the lesser lights may have came into existence, it is very well known that without them we would not be able to open and close our lodges.
