METROLOGY

Ancient Metrology was described by one expert in his vision of it as not a science but a nightmare, and so it would seem at first glance. The study of ancient metrology from the beginning of the 20th. Century has faded way into the background of study priorities.

In earlier times it was a topic of importance and lively debate in order to interpret and derive the architectural intentions of the ancient monuments, to understand travel distances described by classical writers, and, biblical descriptions from other sources. Alexander Thom put forth that ancient megalithic builders in the British Isles and Brittany France had a common unit of measure.

To this day his observations stand neither proven or disproved. In 1847 Augustus DeMorgan stated "There runs through all these national systems a certain resemblance in the measure of lengths; and, if a bundle of rods were made of foot rules, from every nation ancient and modern, there would not be a very unreasonable difference in the lengths of the sticks".



Greetings Brethren;

Welcome to the Month of March. February leaves us with the MM degree of Brother Benjamin Bridges completed. It was a wonderful event, as Lodge individuals collectively came together and performed the Rite.

Looking forward to March there are EA and FC degrees on the horizon. On the celestial calendar, March 20 will mark the Vernal Equinox. I have taken some time and searched the US Naval Observatory website to learn; and have found that what seems like a simple concept is a non-trivial phenomenon. The Equinox is defined as: "the precise time that the sun crosses the equator, making the day and night everywhere of equal length" 1. In the case of San Diego, the actual day which will have exactly 12:00 hours of daylight this year is March 16. This is due primarily to three factors. The equinox is calculated based on the center of the geometric disk of the Sun; and daylight actually begins and ends when the edge of the disk appears and disappears above and below the horizon. Additionally, we actually see the edge of the Sun when it is below the horizon due to the refraction caused by the Earth's atmosphere. Adding to all of this, the elliptical orbit of the Earth about the Sun causes another perturbation known as the 'Equation of Time'. The appearance of the Sun actually runs faster and slower, than the clocks, throughout the calendar year; hence your sundial will only match your wristwatch on four days of the year.



"The Earth's axis of rotation (the straight line through the center of the Earth between the north and south poles) is not perpendicular to the plane of the Earth's orbit. The Earth's axis is tilted by about 23.4° from the direction perpendicular to the orbital plane. The orientation of the Earth's axis in space remains nearly constant even as the Earth revolves around the Sun. It always points in the general direction of the star Polaris."

MORNING STAR

King Solomon's Temple faced East, toward the ": Morning Star", or Venus. The Temple faced east apparently because of the importance of the Sun's symbolical association with the Divine. It is also true, because the "Shekinah", or presence of the Devine, was visible only in the East as a pre-dawn astronomical phenomenon. Astronomically, "Shekinah" represents the concurrence of Venus and Mercury, which is exceedingly rare and does not occur with mathematical precision.

Using state-of-the-art computer software, technicians have recently: dialed back" the time clock to learn what was present in the skies during certain notable events. Surprisingly, the "Shekinah" phenomenon was present on the dates attributed in history to the Exodus of the Jews from Egypt; at the building of King Solomon's Temple; and during the time attributed as the birth of Jesus.
