

Freemasons began using the flower in 1926 as a symbol well known in Germany as message not to forget the poor and desperate. Many other German charities were also using it at this time. In later years, by a handful of Masons, it was a means of recognition in place of the square and compass design. This was done across Nazi occupied Europe to avoid any danger of being singled out and persecuted. Today it is an interchangeable symbol with Freemasonry and some also use the Forget-menot to remember those masons who were victimized by the Nazi regime. In English Freemasonry it is now more commonly worn to remember those that have died as a symbol that you may be gone but not forgotten.
