While studying my 3rd degree lecture to qualify for Master, next year I was curious to know more

about the Temple of Solomon to get an idea of what this great and magnificent temple may have looked like during that time period. It was very fascinating what I found in my readings and wanted to share this with you all.

The gleaming limestone Temple built by King Solomon was built around 950 B.C. was a monument of noble proportions - roughly 180 feet long, 90 feet wide, and 50 feet high. When you entered the temple from the east at the doorway you are met by 40 foot bronze pillars. A porch led into the large main sanctuary, illuminated by small windows near the ceiling. No stone can be seen

anywhere inside the Temple, since the floor was made of cypress and the ceilings had sunken panels in the shape of a square, rectangle or octagon throughout the temple. Past the showbread table at the center of the room and directly behind the incense altar, steps led up to the most sacred place in the Hebrew world: the windowless Holy of Holies. entered just once a year by the High Priest. Greetings Brethren, Ladies and families:

As the 921st District Coordinator for Masonic Outreach Services (MOS) in Division IX, I will be providing you, over the next few months, with information concerning Masonic Outreach Services available to each of us.

It is important that each of us is aware of the benefits and services available to us should we ever fall on hard times or need assistance. I will discuss what services are offered, eligibility for services, and contact information.

In this article we will focus on the "Masonic Center for Youth and Families."

ELIGIBILITY:

- Serves youth ages 4-17
- Does NOT require Masonic affiliation (Serves Masonic Families)
- Must reside in California

SERVICES OFFERED:

- Evaluation, treatment of behavioral, academic, emotional, and social difficulties

- Provided on a sliding scale (\$5. to full payment). Includes travel & lodging for Masons and potentially for non-Masons demonstrating financial need.
- No one is ever denied service.
- Intake is conducted by telephone
- Help connects under age applicants with a local provider
- Actual face to face assessment (evaluation) takes from 2 days to 2 weeks

SERVICES DESCRIPTION:


- Ongoing therapy includes family, couples, and siblings, as necessary
- Case Management / care manager support (family / individual)
- Treatment plan
- If the center cannot assist, they will provide a referral to insurance/services
