Brethren:

I have occasion to begin working in Los Angeles County, at a Mojave Desert location, and will not be able to attend Tuesday Night Lodge Meetings in the near time future.

Having left the familiar confines of San Diego County, I have found interest in some of the history of how the State of California came into being in 1850; some of the Prominent Figures were Masonic Brothers: President James K. Polk, John C. Freemont and Christopher (Kit) Carson.

Here is a brief narrative: President Polk following an expansionist policy to acquire California and its harbors from Mexico commissioned Freemont, who selected Carson as a guide, to explore the Pacific Northwest, eventually leading a popular revolt and seizing control of Settlements beginning from Sonora to Los Angeles. Kit Carson was then sent East with a message to President Polk that California was under United States Control, when He encountered General Stephen W. Kearny traveling west from New Mexico in the Sonora Desert.

General Kearney sent the president's message East, with a detachment of his men, and continued West with Kit Carson as his guide. Upon encountering Mexican troops and being joined by the forces of Lieutenant Archibald H. Gillespie in the San Pasqual Valley, South of present day Escondido, they attacked and were repelled under siege to higher ground. Kit Carson was sent behind enemy lines to San Diego to request reinforcements which eventually dispersed the Mexican Forces.

Today the significance of these men's actions is commemorated locally by: "Kearny Mesa", "Gillespie Field" and "Kit Carson Park". The site of the battle is commemorated as San Pasqual Battlefield State Historic Park, a site on the National Register of Historic Places.

THE MASONIC SQUARE & COMPASS...



Very well known, but very poorly understood, even by scholars. What secrets does it hold? What mysteries does it enshrine?

The answer is, the Masonic Square & Compass relates a powerful ancient wisdom, now lost. It's the symbol of mankind, of you and me.

More specifically, it symbolizes both our *outside* and *inside*. But what exactly does that mean, our outside and inside? It means every human being is made up of two parts. There's the part we see when we look in the mirror each day. But there's also a part that we don't see. The part you see is your body, but the part you don't see is your soul. The Square symbolizes your body, the part you see. The Compass symbolizes your soul, the part you don't see.

When placed together, the Compass & Square is designed to teach us that we're more than just the body. Deep down underneath it all, we are an eternal soul. It's that simple, that powerful.

This is not an opinion, not a hope, not a religion. It's an eternal truth, a wisdom unchangeable. And it forms the basis of a profound Sacred Science, which once informed Freemasonry.

Brother Stefan Werkstetter, Senior Deacon, told me the following, and I also found it on several websites: "The reason we pick up the compass first is because the soul is everlasting and can survive on its own, but the square is picked up last since it is the body and cannot survive without the soul".
