


Remember that we are in space "L" at Santee Lakes recreation center.

Aah, the lovely month of May. You may sometimes hear the phrase "April showers bring May flowers", referring to the ending of the dreariness of winter and the fresh approach of spring. However, it can also be used to refer to the ending of a long period of difficulty and hardship, followed by good and more prosperous times ahead. Nothing could be more applicable to the circumstances we have recently endured.


This year, Mother's Day is Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup>. Please call your Mom! If she has passed, say a prayer for the time and effort she spent raising a family. Remember also that if you have children or grandchildren, there are mothers in your life who deserve to be recognized and adored.

May is also our opportunity as a nation to remember those members of the U. S. military who gave their lives in service to our country and to honor those who are still serving on active duty.

The first is Armed Forces Day, celebrated on the third Saturday. It was first observed on May 20<sup>th</sup>, 1950, to honor those Americans serving in the five U.S. military branches following the consolidation of the military services into the U.S. Department of Defense.

Second is Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day. There is some disagreement about the origin of the observance. We do know that in 1868, General John A. Logan called for a "Decoration Day", which was widely celebrated in both Northern and Southern cities until 1970. The World Wars turned it into a generalized day of remembrance, instead of just for the Civil War. In 1971, Congress standardized the holiday as "Memorial Day" and changed its observance to the last Monday in May. On Memorial Day, the flag of the United States is raised briskly to the top of the staff and then solemnly lowered to the half-staff position, where it remains only until noon. It is then raised to full-staff for the remainder of the day. Please spend a few minutes remembering our fallen heroes and the families mourning their losses.


