Brethren and Ladies:

Is there a proper way to wear your Masonic ring? Should the points of the extended compass be pointed toward you, or away from you?

After becoming a Master Mason and purchasing my ring for the very first time I have heard so many reasons why the points are toward me, or away from me. The first explanation given me is if the points of the compass are pointed toward me I am always remembering my obligations I took when I became a Freemason. On the other hand if the points pointed away from me it signified that I have the opportunity to initiate others into this Ancient and Honorable Fraternity.

After digging deeper into this subject, I came across an article which gave its own view of this subject. One example, the square is the symbol of earthly perfection, and the compass of heavenly perfection. When combined together the points of the compass pointing upward was a symbol of mans aspiration toward God, and the points pointing downward representing heavenly qualities coming from God to Earth.

It seems after reading and hearing both sides of this debate, I have come to the conclusion there is really no right or wrong way a Master Mason should wear his ring. What should be of greater importance is what the square and compass symbolizes to us as Freemasons, and the obligations we took becoming master Masons. Unless told otherwise by the Grand Lodge, how a Master Mason chooses to wear his ring should be a personal one as a member of his Blue Lodge.
