

MISSING LODGE MONEY

Another year and another \$5,701 in dues not paid. So far 46 Brothers, nearly 40% of our membership, have not paid their 2014 dues and of these 21 have not paid for 2013 or 2014. This means that not only will the Lodge not receive its \$2,300, but also has to dip into the lodge funds to pay YOUR per-capita to the Grand Lodge in the amount of \$36.50 per Brother, for a total of \$1,679. So your lodge is losing \$3,979 this year because the dues are not paid. Also remember that the same thing happened with 21 people last year for a total of \$1,722. So, in the last two years the Lodge, and your Brothers, has basically paid your dues with its/our own money in the amount of \$5,701! Obviously this cannot continue and I understand that letters of suspension will be sent to many of those who have not paid, and the suspensions will happen at the end of June I believe. By the way, SW Hackett Lodge's dues are among the lowest in California with at least one as high as \$500 a year.

Certainly if there is hardship involved, that is understandable and it happens, but the Secretary and Master should know of this so that your dues can be remitted. But, just letting them not be paid with any explanation is not the way to go. Please, support YOUR lodge.
