Hello again Brethren and Ladies.

June conjures a time of celebration, sun and picnics for many. This warm sunny time of year reminds me of the fraternal aspect of Freemasonry brings to mind a story that I read recently, published originally in the January 1977 issue of the *New Mexico Freemason*.

I don't know if the story was true or even who wrote it as the author was not mentioned. It did however remind me of the importance of living the values of Freemasonry in our everyday lives and the impact one seemingly insignificant deed can have on someone. The story will be presented in two parts due to the length and I hope everyone can gain a lesson as I did from this story.

"A Good Story"... A young man passed a pawnbroker's shop. The money lender was standing in front of his shop, and the young man noted that he was wearing a large and beautiful Masonic emblem.

After going on a whole block, apparently lost in thought, the young man turned back, stepped up to the pawnbroker, and addressed him: "I see you're wearing a Masonic emblem. I'm a Freemason too. It happens that I'm desperately in need of \$25 just now. I shall be able to repay it within ten days. You don't know me; but I wonder whether the fact that you are a Freemason and that I am a Freemason is sufficient to induce you to lend me the money on my personal note."

The pawnbroker mentally appraised the young man, who was clean-cut, neat and well-dressed. After a moment's thought, he agreed to make the loan on the strength of the young man being a Freemason. Within a few days the young man repaid the loan as agreed and that ended the transaction. About four months later the young man was in a Lodge receiving the Entered Apprentice Degree; he had not really been a Mason when he borrowed the \$25. After he had been admitted for the second section of the degree, the young man looked across the Lodge room and saw the pawnbroker from whom he had borrowed the \$25. His face turned crimson and he became nervous and jittery. He wondered whether he had been recognized by the pawnbroker. Apparently not, so he planned at the first opportunity to leave the Lodge room and avoid his benefactor. As soon as the Lodge was closed he moved quickly for the door.

SW Hackett article from the Grand Lodge "Leader" (Edited for space)

In San Diego Unified School District, a "partnership in education" program connects public schools to local businesses and organizations for support. S.W. Hackett Lodge No. 574 has been among these public partners since 1998, and for the past nine years members have been devoted to Sequoia Elementary School. In addition to answering one-off needs throughout the year, the lodge has established several annual events and activities. S.W. Hackett Lodge is by far our best partnership within the community," says Sequoia Elementary Principal Ryan Kissel. "They have helped many, many families over the years here." James Achenbach, past master and current chair of the lodge's Public Schools Committee, explains:

Dynamic support: The lodge's Public Schools Committee stays in regular contact with school administrators. We learn of the school's needs as they arise. We have provided backpacks with school supplies; renovated classrooms; erected a flagpole; donated funds to buy library books; provided musical instruments and supplies; and more.

Holiday deliveries: Every year, five or six families are identified that are struggling and require assistance for the holidays. The lodge provides everything they need for a holiday meal, a gift card for the family, and gifts for the children. At lodge, we announce all the food and gift items that are needed, and individual members sign up to provide them.

Spelling bee: We sponsor the Sequoia Elementary School spelling bee for fourth, fifth, and sixth graders. We provide cash prizes to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners in each grade. The teachers talk about these prizes year-round to motivate students. The principal takes a moment at the beginning of the event to thank our lodge.

Teacher of the Year dinner: Also each year the school selects a Teacher of the Year, and we honor them at our June stated meeting dinner. The teacher, principal, and their families are guests of honor. We provide the teacher with certificate and honorarium. Photos of the Master and Principal awarding these certificates are posted on our website.

Advice to other lodges: Many larger school districts already have a community partnership program in place. Start with the administration offices, and ask how your lodge can get involved. Try to avoid simply writing checks. To make the experience more meaningful for lodge members, work with the school to figure out opportunities for active participation. "S.W. Hackett Lodge models what it means to be good citizens for our students," says Principal Kissel. "They demonstrate to our kids, 'We care about you.' They stress the importance of obtaining a good education."
