As June comes upon us, I thought that this month I'd write a little on our Masonic suspension process.

Each year our Lodge has the responsibility to pay a dollar amount to The Grand Lodge of California, to show our support. Our members pay their dues, and in turn we pay a per capita out. If any one of us doesn't pay our dues, our lodge still has that responsibility to pay the per-capita for each member. Our CMC tells us that, if a mason has not paid dues in a 12 month period, the secretary shall notify him that he shall be suspended for non-payment, unless he pays his dues in the next stated meeting.

This will happen unless for special reasons he has an inability to pay. Also it is important to realize that we are bound by the CMC to keep confidentiality, and that no proceedings of the lodge not proper to be made public shall be disclosed, either directly or indirectly to any person not otherwise entitled to the same. The members and Officers of Hackett are proud of our members, and hope to encourage you to come to lodge and enjoy the benefits of your lodge, and also we encourage those that haven't paid dues as of yet, to please support your lodge.

This is a good time to remind our brethren that they are welcome to come spend some time here with us at lodge, either for Stated Meetings, Degree's, or Masonic Education.

#### PROUD PAST TO PRESENT THE LONG BLUE LINE


From 1790 to 1877 little coherent information of commanding officers of the then Revenue Marine Service and, Revenue Cutter service and later Seaport Customs Duties have survived to present day as back then the Captains were assigned their posts under the political spoils system of which party came to power. The spoils appointments ceased in 1877 as a more professional service came into being and in 1915 its fleet was merged with the Lighthouse Service, Steamboat inspection Service,

Life Saving Service and became the all-inclusive service we know today as the U.S. Coast Guard. But don't let the title fool you, as I and Brother Covert can tell you of the fire last year on the Tahoe Queen Paddle Wheeler on Lake Tahoe of which the Coast Guard responded to, as their duties cover inland waterways also.

The Broadway Musical 'Hamilton' has brought wide attention to a Masonic Brother in American History a few of his achievements include being a Delegate to the Constitutional Convention, offering input to the Federalist Papers, being the First Secretary of the Treasury and the founder of the service of ten small cutters that became the U.S. Coast Guard established by the 1790 Tariff Act and signed into law by George Washington authorizing the U.S. Treasury under Hamilton to establish
