
EDITOR'S CONTINUAL REQUEST

Let us know if you have a working email address so that we can begin emailing your Trestleboard. This will help save the Lodge and money for postage.



In Search Of Grand Master Hiram

Written by Most Worshipful John R. Heisner, PGM of Masons in California, 2017.

 \mathbf{A} Freemason is a man of the age of 18, or older, who professes a belief in one Supreme Being, and who has been voluntarily initiated into the Craft by a solemn symbolic ceremony performed by members in good standing of a Masonic lodge. The candidate initially proceeds in his Masonic journey as an Entered Apprentice exploring and absorbing the basic Masonic fundamentals.

Next, the candidate advances to the *second degree* as a Fellowcraft and commits himself to acquiring a broader understanding of the liberal arts and *sciences*. Finally, upon *advancing* to *the* third and sublime *degree* of Master Mason, *the candidate* is exposed to the valuable lessons about the distinction *between* mortality and immortality. He is also encouraged to investigate the reality about his own soul.

During his *Masonic* journey, *the* candidate for *professes* several vows of *fidelity and* honor, *the specifics of which relate exclusively to Freemasonry* and *are therefore* are kept "secret" from non-Masons — it is, in fact, one of the few "Masonic secrets" not revealed to the world atlarge. The candidate commits himself to serving the Deity and his laws; promoting the welfare of all Masons, their widows and orphans; and working to make the world where he lives a better place.

History also teaches us that Masons have regularly labored in the protection of that freedom, while many religions have labored to perpetuate their institutions to the exclusion of others. Freemasonry does not sponsor any particular religion, while many religions persist in attempting to convince "non-believers" of their error. Yet, Masons are not irreligious. Freemasonry encourages each individual Mason to attend, serve and support the church and religion of his choice. Ironically, Freemasonry has far too often been condemned and falsely persecuted by some for promoting such free choice. Indeed, throughout history certain segments of society have violently attacked Masons as being heretical simply because Freemasonry as an institution does not and never will endorse any specific religious dogma to the exclusion of all others.

As a fraternity, we should fondly think about our Masonic predecessors who taught each of us that no man's particular view of God and theology, should be preferred over those of another.

The next time you are asked," What is a Mason?" instead of offering the stock reply, "a member of a fraternal society dedicated to self-improvement and charitable works," remember that your Craft's greatest contribution to the formation of this country was the expression of the belief in one Supreme Being, who desires that each man inherit His blessings, and who asks that each person respond to His call freely, deliberately, and uniquely.

I treasure this book because it was presented to me by Most Worshipful Heisner in December of 2017 when he installed me as Master of S. W. Hackett Lodge.
