



S. W. Hackett Lodge No. 574 Free and Accepted Masons of the State of California Chartered October 11th, 1923





Brethren and Ladies:

I want to begin by congratulating Worshipful Jim Achenbach. The Mason of the Year committee chose Brother Jim as this year's honoree for S.W. Hackett. The award presentation will be made at the Grand Master's Reception and "Mason of the Year" Presentation on Saturday, September 10, 2022 with dinner at 6:30pm in the Corinthian Room and the program at 7:30pm. The cost is \$45.00 per person with reservations by August 20, 2022 and \$50.00 per person after August 20, 2022

Most of you know why Brother Jim is so very deserving of this honor, but to those who may not know of the work he has done to better the lodge and help in the community, I am presenting it here. Aside from being continually active in the lodge and working to become the Master of the lodge in 2006, for the past 20 plus years he has been the representative of S.W. Hackett's Partnership in Education program. With his work in this partnership, he has organized so many events. Because of Worshipful Jim's work with Sequoia Elementary School, S.W. Hackett sponsors an annual spelling bee with three grades involved and monetary awards to the first, second and third place winners in each grade. Then in June, S.W. Hackett holds the "Teacher of the Year" event as they honor the teacher chosen by Sequoia as teacher of the year with a dinner, certificate and monetary presentation. Finally, and probably most important, each year near Christmas the Brothers and Ladies of the lodge donate food for a full Christmas dinner and gifts for the children to six families in need, that may otherwise not have had a good Christmas.

Now, to tell you of the July and August we have had and are having. At the Stated Meeting on July 5th, Brother Ethan Carswell presented his second degree proficiency. It was well done and now he looks forward to being raised a Master Mason. We all look forward to that too as Brother Ethan is excited about Masonry and I am especially pleased that as he continues his journey, he is accepting officer's positions to assist and when raised he will be officially an officer of the lodge.

Then the fun of August. Being a "dark" month, the Stated Meeting was short but a couple of important items were voted on and passed. First, \$135 was approved for the Mason of the Year event. Then Worshipful Roberto Reyes, Master of East San Diego Lodge gave a talk about the "Mason for Mitts" event and requested that, like other lodges, S.W. Hackett donate \$200 to the program. Worshipful "JR" Knight made the motion to make the donation and the motion was seconded by Worshipful Clint Black. The Master named Brother "JR" Assistant Secretary of Hackett and he was tasked to take care of the transfer of the \$200.

Last, but by no means least on August 6th the Grand Gale Gala BBQ happened. It was lots of fun and as always, the food was absolutely wonderful.

Stay happy and healthy And be sure to attend the stated dinner and meeting on September 6th.





September 5th Labor Day



Labor Day has deep roots in the **130 years of the labor movement** and its efforts to improve working conditions in America. It is also known as **International Workers' Day** or **May Day** and is celebrated on <u>May 1</u> internationally. With the growth of the Industrial Revolution came the demand for labor and trade unions. Around the 1850s, eight-hour movements across the world aimed to **reduce the working day from ten to eight hours**. At its first congress in 1886, the American Federation of Labour called for a general strike in Chicago on May 1 to demand an eight-hour day, which culminated in what is known today as the Haymarket affair.
