FROM PILLAR OF STRENGTH

Musings from the West

A recent discussion about the pillars in the lodge and their meaning led me to look into duality in the symbols in the lodge.

Candidates pass between two pillars to begin their masonic travels and it has been pointed out that three is the number to consider, the two pillars and the initiate.

Yet it could be argued that an ancient duality is being portrayed in the lodge room symbolically, perhaps because that concept was dismissed early on by the Church of Roman.

Omitted from the scrip-

tures are a number of recently discovered Gnostic gospels dating from the Christian era. Among them the Book of Enoch (though Enoch is referenced in the Bible). In it Enoch walks and talks with God and travels through the heavens with the angels of His creation. Enoch mapped the stars and wrote down the order of the universe at God's command, with angels as his guides, and was returned to earth for a brief time in order to deliver his chronical of the workings of the universe to his children so that they might pass this wisdom down

Masonic Cornerstone Laying

The information on this chart comes from Cornerstones of Freedom: A Masonic Tradition, by S. Brent Morris (published by the Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, in 1993), plus other books and sources.

Date-Details

August 2, 1738: New Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh, Scotland - earliest record of a formal and official Masonic ceremony

April 15, 1791: Jones Point - first boundary stone of Washington, D.C.

October 13, 1792: White House (then called the President's House) in Washington, D.C.

September 18, 1793: United States Capitol Building in Washington, D.C. - George Washington presided

October 12, 1793:

University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, North Carolina

July 4, 1815: Washington Monument, Baltimore, Maryland

1823: Erie Canal, New York

June 17, 1825: Battle of Bunker Hill Monument, near Boston, Massachusetts

1847: Smithsonian Institution, in Washington, D.C.

July 4, 1848: Washington Monument, in Washington, D.C.

through the ages.

Gnostic writings argue that Enoch was given this knowledge solely for the purpose of gaining the adoration of we the frail beings of His creation. Thus they reasoned and taught that the God who created this universe was a vain and misguided creator. This Creator believed Himself to be the Great Architect of the Universe when in fact (according to these Gnostic texts), unknown to Him, His Mother (the story of Sophia) had created Him by stealing away and planting a seed from His Father the true Supreme Being.

Thus these Gnostic Christians believed that living beings are forced to suffer in each of their individual vessels throughout each lifetime, each soul being forcibly separated from the Supreme Being until death, or possibly even until time shall be no more, before the soul is allowed to return home.

Dismissed by the early Roman Church, these gospels were omitted from scripture and believers excommunicated.

Could an argument be made that this ancient duality

is represented in the lodge room symbolically?

Could it be that the pillars represent these two gnostic deities?

Boaz the everliving Supreme Being, and Jachin the Jahova who established the universe.

Perhaps, but certainly the argument can be made that Enoch is represented by the Geometry of Pythagoras who was able to explain natural law through logic and determine how the universe is ordered and functions.

In effect Enoch represents the faculty of reason given to all men by the Creator so that we might have the ability to marvel at the works of His creation.
