FAMOUS MASONS

Arthur Roy Brown

December 23, 1893 – March 9, 1994

Captain in the Royal Flying Corps in World War I, Brown holds the distinction of being the man who shot down the famous German pilot Manfred von Richtofen, the Red Baron, on April 21, 1918 while he was pursuing another Canadian pilot.

Credited with downing ten enemy planes, Brown was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross on November 2, 1917, with a Bar on June 21, 1918. Initiated: 1915 St. Johns Lodge, Carlton Place, Ontario, Canada

Glenn Ford

May 1, 1916 – August 30, 2006

Born Gwyllyn Samuel Newton Ford in Sainte-Christine, Quebec, Canada, actor Glenn Ford appeared in 106 films and several television series.

During his military service he received the French Legion of Honor in 1992 for his service in World War II, the Medal of Honour, presented by the VFW, the Medaille de la France for the liberation of France, and two commendation medals from the US Navy, and was inducted into the Vietnamese Legion of Merit.

More than half of his movie appearances were in westerns but Ford played equally well in comedies and film noir, and was voted the number one male box office attraction in 1958. He was inducted into the national Cowboy Hall of Fame by the Western Heritage Museum in 1978.

HOW MANY GRAND LODGES WERE THERE IN ENGLAND IN THE 18TH CENTURY?

Four. The original Grand Lodge organized in 1717 at the Apple Tree Tavern Charles Street, Covent Garden, London. The Grand Lodge of All England at York, 1725. (Dormant in a few years, revived in 1761, but no trace after 1792). The Grand Lodge of England, south of the river Trent, established in 1779, also at York. The only real rival, constituted July 17, 1751 at the Turk's Head Tavern, Greek Street, Soho, London, as the Grand Lodge of England according to the Old Constitutions, called "Ancients" and also spoken of as "Athol Masons".

ARE ANY OF THE FOUR ORIGINAL LODGES OF THE FIRST GRAND LODGE OF ENGLAND STILL IN EXISTENCE?

The Lodge of Antiquity, No. 2, is the oldest Lodge in England, and one of the four which participated in February, 1717, in the meeting at the Apple Tree Tavern. At that time this Lodge met at an alehouse, with the sign "Goose and Gridiron" in St. Paul's Church yard.
