December Greetings from the West,

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to the Members of our Lodge who have helped me progress to the point of being elected to serve as Master of S.W. Hackett Lodge for 2016. This past week I retrieved from the bookshelf, my signed copy of the "Monitor" which I received upon my initiation in September, 1999. I see familiar names of some of the Stalwarts of our Lodge who have endured to this point. Wor. Clint Black was the Master and Wor. Dimiter Lyakov was Senior Warden. David Casper, Wor. David Haslim, Wor. John Gamache were present, as well at the two gentlemen who I first met at the Del Mar Fair, manning the Masonic Booth in the Infield of the racetrack; the persons whom I asked if I could become a Mason, Wor. William Mathis and Wor. Michael Allen.

This past month I have attended the 14th Annual World Conference of Regular Free and Accepted Masons in San Francisco. On display, in resplendent unity, was the mutual recognition of Three Grand Lodges in the Jurisdiction of California. The Grand Lodge of California, the Prince Hall Grand Lodge of California, and the Grand Lodge of Iran in exile, together they shared the stage as Cohosts of this International Event.

As an Observer, here are some of my notes from the presenters of North and South America, Western and Eastern Europe, Israel and Africa. It is a picture, with many facets, that I offer to elucidate, in your own mind, the current place of our Lodge, and to ask what realized kinetic future is in store from its potential.

Globalization of the world is here; electronic technology is interconnecting everything that we do as a civilized world. It's similar to advances in the past which changed the way we live. Think of the epic changes like the Gutenberg printing press, steam locomotion of ships, industry and trains, the harnessing of electricity and the invention of automobiles, aircraft and spacecraft.

At the same time of this progress, a contrary World of Disorder is expanding against the World of Order. There are mass migrations of people trying to escape the tyrannies of evil from the collapse of governments in North Africa, Syria and Central America. It's not your imagination, it's really happening; the evil acts of violence are no longer only in faraway places. Look to Paris, where the recent attacks have spilled over into Western Europe.

Where does Masonry have anything to do with all of this? We look to the past, and see great leaders, Washington, Lafayette, Roosevelt and Churchill et al, what about now? Masonic membership roles in the Western World have been in decline since the 1950s, and efforts to stop the decline have proven to be futile. In the Developing world, Masonry

is on the increase, and is challenged by a promulgation of non-regular factions which tend to make up their own ideas, leading to a casting of falsehoods upon the Craft.

The answer to the question lies ahead, it's the under 25 generation. They embrace the new technologies as tools. However the human factor in these technologies is their weakest link. The dictatorship of materialism and religion is blocking the universal moral principles which give us our freedoms from passions, vices and profanities.

The humanitarian cause of Masonry is not to change the world, but to teach the cardinal virtues of morality, in and out of the lodge, to an ends of improving man's ongoing struggles for Liberty which in turn, manifests itself as the Universal Standard of Freedom for all of Mankind.
