



SIR JOSEPH BANKS

English naturalist, Mason and member of the Royal Society. He was born in Argyle Street, London, on the 13th of February 1743. His father, William Banks, was the son of a successful Lincolnshire doctor, who became sheriff of his county, and represented Peterborough in parliament; and Joseph was brought up as the son of a rich man.

In 1760 he went to Oxford, where he showed a decided taste for natural science and was the means of introducing botanical lectures into the university. In 1764 he came into possession of the ample fortune left by his father, and in 1766 he made his first scientific expedition to Newfoundland and Labrador, bringing back a rich collection of plants and insects. Shortly after his return, Captain Cook was sent by the government to observe the transit of Venus in the Pacific Ocean, and Banks, through the influence of his friend Lord Sandwich, obtained leave to join the expedition in the "Endeavour", which was fitted out at his own expense.

The voyage occupied three years and many hardships had to be undergone; but the rich harvest of discovery was more than adequate compensation. Banks was equally anxious to join Cook's second expedition and expended large sums in engaging assistants and furnishing the necessary equipment. He employed the assistants and materials he had collected in a voyage to Iceland in 1772.

In 1778 Banks succeeded Sir John Pringle as president of the Royal Society, of which he had been a fellow from 1766, and held the office until his death. In 1781 he was made a baronet; in 1795 he received the order of the Bath; and in 1797 he was admitted to the Privy Council. He died at Isleworth, London on the 19th of June 1820.

As president of the Royal Society he did much to raise the state of science in Britain, and was at the same time most assiduous and successful in cultivating friendly relations with scientific men of all nations. It was, however, objected to him that from his own predilections he was inclined to overlook and depreciate the labors of the mathematical and physical sections of the Royal Society and that he exercised his authority somewhat despotically. He bequeathed his collections of books and botanical specimens to the British Museum.

THE BURDEN OF BEING WONDERFUL

When my family and I moved from Germany to San Diego in December 2015, I started looking at the local lodges to find a new masonic home. I contacted a few lodges, but without success. Then, at the end of January 2016, I reached out to S.W. Hackett Lodge #574 and got a reply in less than 24 hours, including an invitation to the upcoming 2nd degree.

Two days later. I went to the meeting, both nervous and excited, as this was my first meeting in a U.S. lodge ever.

Among other things, freemasonry in Germany emphasizes the "universal masonic chain of brotherhood", which means that we will welcome any brother of a regular lodge worldwide, to make him feel home when travelling in distant countries.

I was overwhelmed with the kindness, anticipation and candor of the brethren of S.W Hackett Lodge when I first met them. Coming from a different Grand lodge on a different continent, I was curious what the California ritual would look like. The traditional examination of a first time visitor revealed some general variations already, but also allowed me to recognize universal parts of the masonic ritual. The meeting was impressive – the whole ritual was memorized, and not read from a book like in my Germany mother lodge. Excited about this performance, I came back on a regular basis.

After a couple of weeks, WB Dennis asked me if I wanted to act as Junior Steward in a degree. This was a great opportunity to intensify my understanding of the masonic ritual. Learning by doing is more efficient than learning by watching. After a couple of months, S.W. Hackett became my new masonic home and I affiliated in mid-2016. I got encouraged to grow further, first as Junior Deacon, and soon as Senior Deacon, which would not have been possible without the continuous support and motivation of WB Dennis and the officers.

WB JR tends to say that S.W. Hackett lodge is the best lodge ever - I can completely confirm this. The officers create the fertile soil on which this wonderful lodge grows and prospers. It is up to our new brethren to recognize and embrace this opportunity to both work on their own and the lodge's growth. Masonry offers a toolbox to create wonderful things, and it's up to us to use these tools.
